What is a FOAPAL?



- FOAPAL = an acronym unique to the Banner system
- Describes each of the six elements (accounting codes) of our Chart of Accounts
- Necessary to process purchases in Deacon Depot.

F – Fund*

O – Organization*

A – Account*

P – Program*

A – Activity Code

L - Location Code

* - These elements are required.




- "Pot of money" that is kept track of separately
- Known as "source" of funds or "how" funds came to be
- May be unrestricted or restricted
- May be specific to one department or shared by many departments (e.g., the University operating fund – 111111)

- Indicates budget or unit of responsibility (department)
- Defines who spends the money
- Select or enter your department if using the unrestricted fund (111111)
- Defaults in when choosing fund types other than unrestricted





- Defines what the funds are being spent on
 - Assets (1xxxx)
 - Liabilities (2xxxx)
 - Expenses (5xxxx)

Examples		
Assets	15010	Inventory
Liabilities	21507	Deposits – Agency Funds
Expenses	53010	Supplies





- Defines purpose/reason for a transaction:
 - Instruction, Research, Administrative, etc
- Set by NACUBO a Pseudo standard-setting body for how higher education financial statements should be organized.
- No need to select in Deacon Depot system will auto-populate.





- Use is optional
- Often referred to as "Ucodes"
- Typically used to account for special projects or events
 - Graduation
 - Freshman orientation
 - Speaker series
- Can involve one or multiple departments





- Use is optional
- Represents physical locations for fixed assets or maintenance costs
